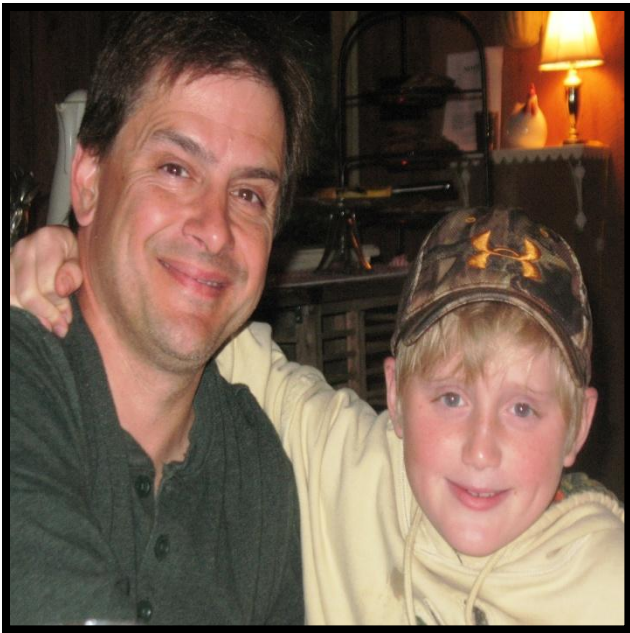




Ryan Dwyer caught a whopper 18 inch Brown



as did his Grandfather, Bob Dwyer Jr.

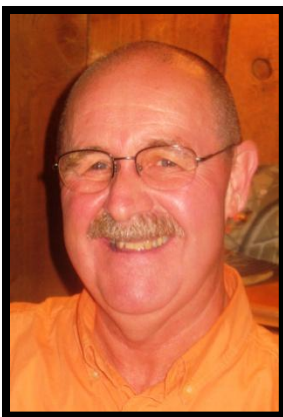


Bob's guests were Wayne Cerinetti and son Zachary

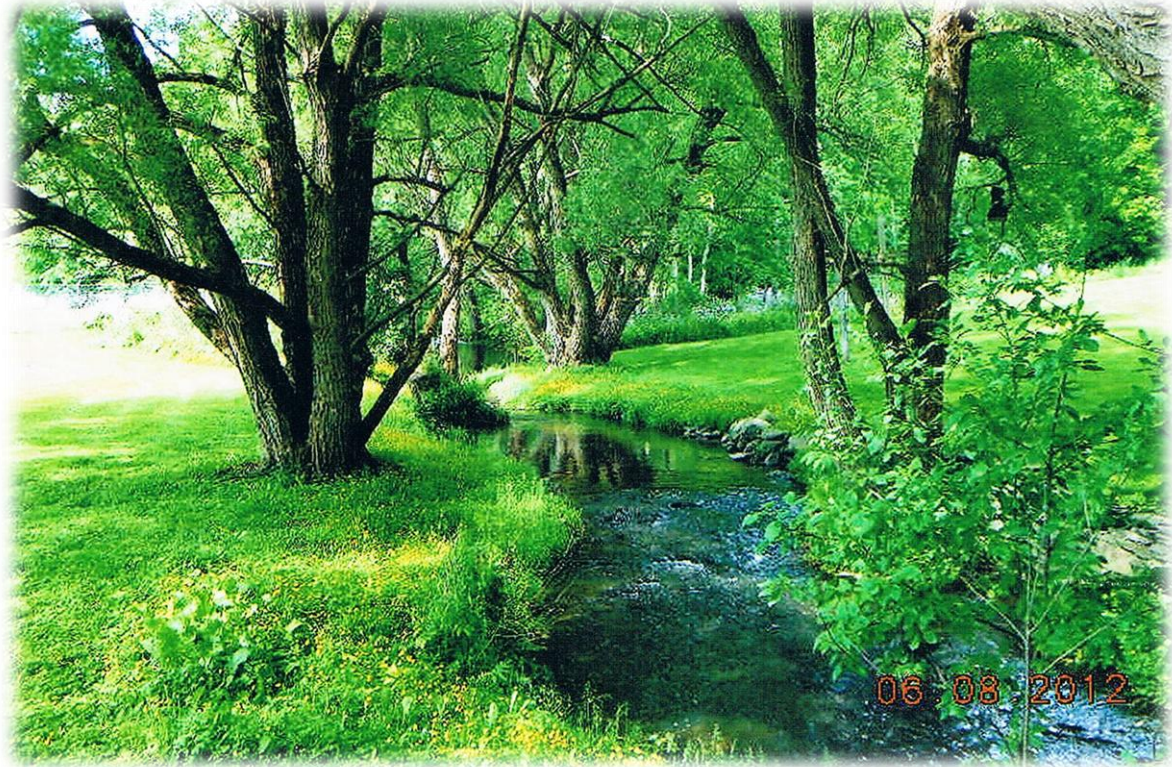

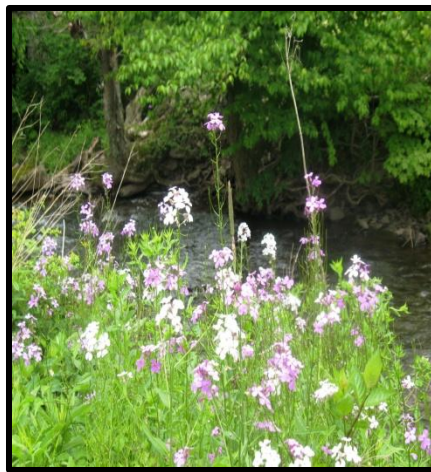

You might say. The brown trout above came from beneath the moss laden rock on which this picture was taken. Oh, there goes Lenny with a *"hand full"*



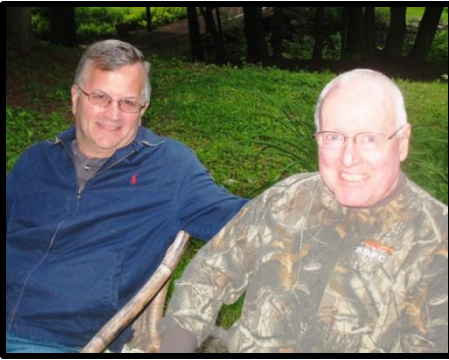

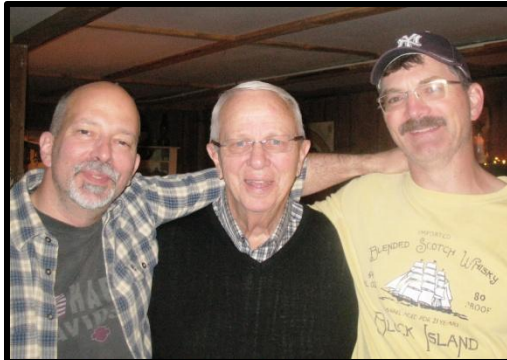




Dave Dimmick's 16 inch Brook Trout, both of the crabs on the right were taken from it's stomach.
