President's Corner


It was less than a month ago (as a matter of fact) on February 19th, that I saw a news report that stated a large ice jam in the Town of Delhi had local officials and nearby residents on high alert. The ice jam was in the West Branch of the Delaware River roughly two miles upstream from the villiage of Delhi.

The article went on to say that the ice jam was approximately a quarter mile in length according to Wayne Reynolds, the Public Works Commisioner for Delaware County. *"it's a very good size ice jam,"* said Reynolds, *"It starts in an area we call Still Water."*

"I've never seen one like this, not with these massive pieces of ice" stated a local resident who lives nearby. Officials said that if the jam were to suddenly dislodge, it could cause problems downstream. "It means trouble," Reynolds said, referring to potential flooding downstream. "As this amount of ice moves, the next constriction downstream will probably catch it again. And, if that's in a more built up community it could be big problems. For those homes that are really low in elevation and adjacent to the river, certainly getting their basements cleaned out and getting everything on higher floors like critical documents in safe locations or even off site are preventitive moves residents can take," said Reynolds.


All I can say is: I'm glad I wasn't fishing in that area at the time. But hopefully I will the last week of April.




